INSPIRING STORY TIME AT WOMEN'S ENTERPRISE NETWORK MEETING

One of the founders of Strategy Story, the Highlands and Islands based strategic development consultancy, has been announced as the guest speaker at next month's Women's Enterprise Network meeting.
