## INSPIRING WOMEN SPEAKERS LINED UP FOR HIGHLAND AND EAST PERTHSHIRE WOMEN'S ENTERPRISE NETWORK MEETINGS

Holistic practitioner Alison Strandberg and Brenda Roddy, the co-owner of the 'best small green hostel in Scotland' have been announced as the guest speakers at this month's east Perthshire and Highland Perthshire Women's Enterprise Network meetings.

First up is Fife-based Alison at the east Perthshire Women's Enterprise Network meeting in Blairgowrie on Tuesday, May 7. Alison has worked as a holistic practitioner for twenty years, focusing on providing services that heal the body, mind and soul.

She offers a range of therapies and intuitive techniques such as Reiki, coaching and meditation to help people physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually and says that compassion, connection and creativity are the three words that best sum up how she wants her clients to feel about working with her.

Then on Thursday, May 9, at Erigmore in Dunkeld, Brenda Roddy will talk about running a luxury eco-friendly hostel business in Perthshire. As well as helping to develop and run Jessie Mac's hostel in Dunkeld, Brenda also chaired the local tourism association for three years. She also works for Angus Council on climate change and active travel and is an enterprise facilitator with GrowBiz.

Organised by community-based enterprise support organisation GrowBiz, the Women's Enterprise Network meetings are designed to support women running or growing a business in rural Perthshire, as well as those who are just thinking about setting up on their own.

The events take place every month at various locations throughout Perthshire and provide an opportunity for women to get together, network and exchange business cards and hear from inspirational speakers in an informal setting.

Jackie Brierton is CEO of GrowBiz.

She said: "We are delighted to be able to welcome Alison to our east Perthshire Women's Enterprise Network meeting and Brenda to our Highland event this month.

"I am very much looking forward to this event and learning more about the techniques and teaching Alison offers.

"Running your own business can be a challenging experience at times – we know that being selfemployed, particularly in rural areas can sometimes feel quite isolating - and it is important that local entrepreneurs remember to take time to invest in nurturing and caring for themselves just as they nurture and care for their businesses or families.

"Alison is an intuitive and engaging speaker who is passionate about supporting people to make the most of their inner strength and whose enthusiasm is infectious."

She continued: "Brenda is passionate about environmental issues and working towards ensuring that Jessie Mac's is, among many other things, an eco-friendly accommodation provider.

"She has a fascinating story to tell as well as lots of tips to share on how to make your business as environmentally friendly as possible, which – given the focus on climate change at the moment – is more relevant than ever."

The Women's Enterprise Network meeting in east Perthshire takes place on Tuesday, May 7, at The Dome Café on Leslie Street in Blairgowrie.

The Highland Perthshire Women's Enterprise Network meeting takes place om Thursday, May 9, in Erigmore, Birnam.

Both events take place from 6pm to 8.30pm and a light buffet and refreshments will be provided. As well as hearing from the inspirational guest speaker there will also be a chance for participants to ask questions. Both events are free.
